

Sources for the revised Map of Tudor London

The sources for the maps and gazetteer in the Atlas are listed [here](#). For the map revision, as before, H.A. Harben's *Dictionary of London* (1918), now [online](#), is an invaluable source. The following list covers publications since 1989 on which we have drawn for the revision, and some earlier works revisited, including those now more widely available thanks to [British History Online](#).

Numerous archaeological reports, mostly by Museum of London Archaeology, have transformed our knowledge of many sites. Visual and documentary sources published by the London Topographical Society and the London Record Society have also made an important contribution, but perhaps the most exciting piece of 'new information' for the map of early Tudor London is the discovery of a third plate of the 'Copperplate' map of London, reproduced and discussed in Saunders & Schofield 2011.
